2013 RTTY ROUNDUP

Here are the preliminary results of our efforts in the 2013 RTTY Roundup as compared to last year. We are a little over 117K Ahead of last year with 6 of us improving and a few of us not. Six stations increased while 3 stations ended up below last years Individual totals. Keep in mind these are claimed scores and are Subject to log checking by the sponsor of the event.

The chart below shows how each team member contributed to the overall score this year as compared to 2012.

This is truly a team effort and it makes no difference what your score is or what you have for a station. What matters is that you give it a try.
