Records Are Made to Be Broken!

For several years Bruce TMC and I talked about doing another Multi-Single in the RTTY Roundup. The last time we did MSLP was in 2007. We talked many times about what we did wrong back then and what could we do to better our effort and break the Atlantic Division MSLP record. Bruce was very new to RTTY contesting in 2007 so we had to learn to work together on the fly. We had a blast but made many mistakes.

Since that time Bruce caught the RTTY bug and set up a station at home where he has been successful in placing 1st in WNY in his class in the Roundup several times. After 6 years of Bruce running WA2TMC from home we finally made the decision to do a MS. We had to make a decision which class to enter. Bruce and I both had been running high power in our respective classes over the last 4-5 years and we were leaning that way. Low Power is a very tough class in the Roundup and the Atlantic Division Record was set in 2003 and has not been challenged except for last year (2013) by Rich K2EN who came within 5K of the 2003 record. I talked Bruce into running Low Power with the thought that we had a good chance to besting the 2003 score.

So we picked 2014 to give it a try again. My thought was 10 meters would be good enough for some extra Q's and that would enhance our score. If we waited until 2015 that window might be closed. So we set some goals we thought were attainable.

- 1. Best the ADR record of course
- 2. Average at least 50 an hour
- 3. Score 150K
- 4. Place in the top 5 W/VE
- 5. Have Fun!

I'm happy to say before log checking that we made all of our goals. After log checking we will find out how we really did.

Here is how we faired with our goals:

- 1. We bested the 2003 record by 55K
- 2. We averaged 57.3 an hour
- 3. Score about 170K
- 4. Before log checking we are 2nd W/VE
- 5. Again we had a blast, we laughed from start to finish.

If you have never worked in a multi-op you don't know what you're missing. I know many of you have worked at the club when we did multi-op and I hope you enjoyed it. Some of you should think about putting your own multi-Op team together.

If you would like to operate at N2WK sometime let me know.

With my situation here it's not likely I will be able to run a club station multi-op but I can here. You all know I need to stay close to home these days.
